


MISSION

Sincere Studio's mission is to provide sewing and textile art education with a focus on sewing as a tool of social change and empowerment.

VISION

Our vision is straightforward: we aim to establish an inclusive and inviting space where all members of our community, and beyond, can learn to sew while building a sense of community. Central to our mission is prioritizing marginalized community members and ensuring a safe environment that embraces people of all genders, ages, races, and abilities. Recognizing the traditionally high barriers to entry in sewing, we are committed to fundamentally reducing these obstacles as a core aspect of our mission.

In our first year, over 250 people took our intro to sewing class. This class is a introductory class for people with no sewing experience. Students leave with a completed project and confidence in their new skill.

Many of these sewists returned to our studio for more classes and affinity groups and began forming what is now a thriving community space.

* STUDIO INCOME

For much of 2023, we operated as a fiscally sponsored organization, under arts non-profit Fractured Atlas. In October of 2023, we however became our own registered 501C3. This has created many new funding opportunities for us and we have since been working hard to increase the amount of grant funding we are seeking.

* STUDIO EXPENDITURES

During our first year, we slowly built out our studio space to include accessibility-focused equipment and furniture. Our "studio" expenditures reflect studio build-out costs, including purchasing equipment, tools, and materials as well as advertising and administrative costs.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

Our goals for our second year are focused on expanding our outreach in sewing skills and community engagement. We have organized these objectives into three main areas: classes, clubs, and workshops; events; and community partnerships.

In the realm of classes, clubs, and workshops, our aim for the upcoming year is to increase our programming offerings and enhance accessibility to sewing resources. involves boosting the frequency of affinity group meetings, promoting awareness and utilization of our sliding scale fee structure, and providing additional support for novice sewists. To reduce barriers to entry, we plan to expand access to sewing equipment such as machines through our sewing machine library, empowering beginners to integrate sewing into their lives and practice their newfound skills. Additionally, we are working to sustainability-focused classes, which will cover topics like clothing repair and upcycling.

Regarding events, our goal is to grow event attendance and diversify our calendar with new offerings. These events, which are open to the community at no cost, are designed to strengthen our sewing community. New events slated for the upcoming year include the Community Mending Night, a masc-centered clothing swap, and sustainability-focused demonstrations and information booths at local events. We will also reintroduce popular events such as Sew &



Tell, an event for our community to showcase their sewing projects, and our highly successful fabric and yarn swap, which drew participants from as far away as Seattle.

In terms of community programming, we are committed to deepening our connections with like-minded organizations in our area. For instance, we have organized events where members of the Sincere Studio community repaired sleeping bags for individuals at the Right 2 Dream Too encampment. Additionally, we offer complimentary classes to nonprofits that share our values, such as SWANA Rose, and aim to expand these partnerships in the coming year.

Overall, our second-year goals revolve around expanding our reach and impact in teaching sewing skills and fostering community engagement, through enhanced programming, diverse events, and strengthened community partnerships.
